

Spirit of Twinning

Ordinary tourism can be superficial, perhaps restricted to sight-seeing, a hotel and limited contact with locals.

By contrast, twinning will introduce you directly to French families and you will stay in their homes.

When the French visit us, you will have the opportunity to welcome them into your home and/or help with the visit.

This leads to greater understanding and friendship between our two countries.

What happens?

Every year we take it in turns to visit each other's country. The host village arranges sight-seeing and entertainment. This is normally over a long weekend.

In addition, there are often small, special interest trips. For example, we have had:

- workshops for amateur musicians and singers with joint performances
- a visit from the top class of the primary school in Artannes
- a cookery event introducing the French to English Christmas cooking
- a tour of English gardens
- a beer appreciation weekend
- shared holidays examples have been Devon, Brittany, the Isle of Wight and Bordeaux.

Practicalities

It doesn't cost anything to be part of the Twinning Association—just join our mailing list.

Accommodation will be given to you free in France but there will be a contribution from guests towards communal meals and activities. Travel to Artannes is usually in private cars or public transport and it may be possible to arrange lifts.

You don't need to speak or understand French although it helps.

The French are always interested in meeting new families. This might be a fascinating way for your children to experience another culture.

Does this appeal?

If this sounds interesting, bear in mind the following points.

You need to:

- be interested in France and the French way of life
- be happy to stay in a French home and not bothered by unfamiliar food and customs
- be prepared to offer reciprocal hospitality or help in other ways
- live within the Bathford/Kingsdown area
